On October 17 at 11:30 AM, members of the congregation gathered to dedicate our new sign. Though the sign was erected earlier this vear. it seemed right to dedicate it when we celebrated the birth of Cedarhurst Unitarian Universalists.

Dean Camlin, Maria Warburton, Cindy Hirshberg, Kathy Sheridan, Pamela Malkin, and Carl Byrne worked for several months considering designs and thinking about our congregation. After tireless work they came up with the design, which can be seen from both directions on the highway, includes banners stating our values of openness to all, commitment to Siding with Love, and Black Lives Matters.



As a focal point of the sign a Chalice was designed and created by Carl and Steve Byrne, and their brother in law Glen Norris. The brothers personally installed the Chalice as a sign of our liberal faith.

We thank Teel Byrne's family who gave their time, treasure, and talents to this project in memory of their mother. We also give thanks for the endowment fund which met the remaining financial needs for the project.

This sign will bring us into the future as a center piece calling people to our liberal and liberating faith. Below are the words of the dedication, inspired by the Meditation on the Four Directions by Rev. Julia Hamilton.

NORTH: FARTH

Earth is the element of the north representing deep wisdom, stability, and strength.

We dedicate this sign to the strength of this community, to the ways that it is nurtured, and embodies deep wisdom and strength. We dedicate this sign.

EAST: AIR

Air is the element of the east reminding us of air, breath, and inspiration - literally taking in air*. East reminds us of fresh starts, intellect, and new ideas.

We dedicate this sign to the inspiration- the taking in breath, the new ideas, the intellect and the mind that we utilize in ourselves and our community. Blowing with a fresh start, and inspiration we dedicate this sign.

SOUTH: FIRE

Fire is the element of the south reminding us of transformation and change. We are reminded of birds moving to south seeking warmth.* South is a call to action, inner passion and inner force, inner cold seeking change—call to action.

We dedicate this sign to the inner passion and inner force, the call to action we have, the transformation that this sign represents. We dedicate this sign.

WEST: WATER

Water is the element of the west. It reminds us of coming together, self reflection, and self understanding. Water is always flowing – both calm and turbulent.

We dedicate this sign to water as we come together in community, always flowing, turbulent and clam water- coming together in community, always flowing, turbulent, calm. Full of self-reflection and self-understanding. We dedicate this sign.

CENTER: SPIRIT

We come to the center – connection with the spirit and the inner self. We dedicate this sign to the connection of the inner self of this community and to our faith in the spirit of life and change and to one another. We dedicate this sign.

At present, the donations are being entered into Bid Beacon.com, our auction site. The instructions for signing up as a Bidder and a few other tips will be emailed to you shortly along with a summary of the available items. You will have access to reviewing the auction items online very soon so you can plan your bidding selections accordingly.

The Auction opens for active bidding at 1:00 PM on Sunday, October 31st. Please also join the Watch Party which starts at 12:30PM just before the Auction goes live. Just use the Zoom link on the Cedarhurst Calendar. Once you are signed up as a bidder, you will be able to bid and counter bid, affectionately referred to as a bid-volley, day and night until the Auction closes on Sunday, November 7th at 6:00PM. Feel free to also join the Closing Watch Party, which is also shown on the Cedarhurst Calendar.

A special treat will happen on Saturday, November 6th at 5:30 PM. It's an online "live Auction" where we'll use the magic of Zoom to bid on some of the most popular and unusual meals and experiences donated for the Auction. Again, look for the Zoom Links on the Cedarhurst Calendar.

On a more serious note, Cedarhurst Unitarian Universalists, like many other faith communities, has become very creative and resourceful about raising funds to fulfill our budget goals during the COVID-19 pandemic.
