Pandemic Reflections After Twenty-One Months

As I reflect on the first twenty-one months of no-more-life-as-usual due to COVID-19, I'm surprised to find that my first feeling is one of gratitude. The pandemic slowed me down. A LOT. I needed that, and did not know it. I've had more time than I ever wanted to reflect on everything – my daily activities, my career goals, my faith, my activism, my family relationships, my friendships.

That last one has been an unexpected, and welcome, benefit to the disruption of life as usual. I have deepened existing friendships, made new friends, and reconnected via social media with people from my past that I realized had shaped me throughout my life.

When Cedarhurst began Zoom services in March of 2020, I have to admit that I really hated it. Seeing everyone on Zoom served as a weekly reminder that we couldn't be together. But now, I find myself looking forward to connecting in this way. I watch to see who joins the Zoom, what their surroundings look like (who'd have thought we'd be looking inside each other's living spaces every week?). And the funny moments – our four-legged family members climbing around and behind and on top of us. Hearing choice words from time to time when someone forgot to mute.

And the guest speakers we've been able to invite because there are no geographic restrictions! This has been wonderful! Of course having our own Rev Amy every other week has provided some continuity and stability, much needed during this time. And Amy is truly available to us just about any time we are in need. I encourage you to "use her" when things get tough, or when you just want to talk about anything at all. She is *there* for us.

I'm learning to let negative feelings go. They were threatening to undo me for a while there, and I knew that I would be no good to anyone if I let that happen. For many months, I was angry at the misinformation spreaders, the conspiracy theorists, the capital rioters, the election fraud insisters. But I had to let it go. I started keeping a log every night before bed that I call "Blessings of the Day". I've kept it almost every night since about the first of August. It has made a definite difference in my outlook. I write down anything from "I heard a bird singing outside my window" to "my son called" to "I ate a healthy snack instead of Cheetos".

I regularly call on the positive energy of the universe – some call it God – to help me through each day. Sometimes I get really discouraged, I lose hope, I struggle to be optimistic. But you, my Cedarhurst family, have helped me keep things in perspective, and I thank you for that! This congregation is a wonderful mix of backgrounds, spiritual experiences, life events, world views. We learn from each other. We grow, we change, we argue, we hurt each other's feelings sometimes. Then we forgive. We reconnect. We remember why we're here. This is Cedarhurst, and I'm glad to be with you on this journey, especially during a pandemic.

CONGRATULATIONS!

After weeks of preparation and planning, the 2021 Fall Auction benefitting Cedarhurst Unitarian Universalists was successful. Together, the friends and members of Cedarhurst raised \$12,396. The money raised supports our popular Scrip program to the tune of \$3,900 and the Operating Budget was enhanced by \$8,490. This is an excellent accomplishment for our self-supporting congregation.

At the close of the auction, Bidders received an email from Bid Beacon listing their winnings and making it possible to settle-up online. Then the Great Cedarhurst Auction Swap took place in the parking lot on November 20. As in past years, people came a bit early and stayed a bit late to enjoy this outdoor opportunity to say hello and catch up with people not seen in person since the arrival of pandemic safety precautions.

Part of the Auction fun is to take a closer look at some additional dimensions. Thanks to you, Cedarhurst received 91 donated items. Thirty-one bidders exchanged 356 separate bids, averaging almost a dozen bids by each during Auction week. Clearly a good number of the items were hotly pursued.

Huge thanks to the donors of the 12 meals and activities reserved for bidding on Saturday evening, November 6th for the first-ever Live Online Auction hosted on Zoom. These 64 "seats" at meals and trips basically sold out during the Zoom event, with only three seats remaining. Additional favorites were the two beautiful, hand-embroidered designs donated by Sharon Kennedy. One changed bidders 27 times and the other changed 32 times. Together they raised almost \$500 for our Cedarhurst community.

Another clear favorite was the Scrip Cards offered by Jay Levenson. A Scrip card is prepaid for use in local grocery stores. As an incentive, Jay offered an additional \$25 scrip card with each \$100 purchased. There were 40 offered and there was only one remaining when the Auction closed.

The Fall Auction has been a favorite social event at Cedarhurst for many years. The meals and activities have always helped to fill one's social calendar throughout the year. It has certainly been an important source of financial support. The pandemic forced us to switch to an online auction and through it all, we have managed to retain the continuity and fun on behalf of Cedarhurst. Thank you, everybody, for yet another successful Fall Auction!
