ANNOUNCEMENTS AND UPCOMING PROGRAMS AT CEDARHURST UU

I hope everyone has been enjoying the summer services. Thank you to all who have helped make them possible, including the lay leaders, zoom coordinators, A/V setup in the building, in-person greeters and hospitality, as well those cleaning the building and weeding the gardens and coordinating with Channing Memorial Church.

Hopefully, additional members and friends will begin to feel comfortable filling these and other roles needed to make the multi-platform (combination in-person and zoom) services continue as planned.

There are four summer services scheduled for the month of August, followed by a joint outdoor gathering with Channing on Sunday of Labor Day weekend. The services, including the last Sunday in July, are as follows:

July 31: Palliative care led by Jen Garner, from Bridging Life (formerly Carroll Hospice)

August 7: Equanimity - a Buddhist coping strategy led by Alan Bogage

August 14: Beyond Land Acknowledgement led by Bekah Waters

August 21: Discussion of Pema Chodron led by Meghan Mulvenna

August 28: Channing led service

As of now, all speakers from **July 31 – August 21** plan to be in Cedarhurst's building, with Cedarhurst hosting multi-platform services. All are welcome to attend in person or via Zoom.

September 4: There will be no service in the building or on zoom. Instead, we will be joining Channing for an in-person gathering at a pavilion in Piney Run Park. The plans are still being formulated but will likely include a service with lots of singing followed by either a potluck or bring-your-own lunch. There is a \$6 entrance fee per vehicle for in county residents and \$12 for out of county. However, if anyone in the vehicle is 62 or older, then the vehicle (and all its occupants) gets in free.

On **September 11th**, we return to our regular services with Rev. Amy conducting our annual water communion service. We are currently filling out the guest speaker schedule for the Fall and Winter. For newcomers to our congregation, Rev. Amy typically is in the pulpit on the first and third Sundays, from September – June, and we have a guest speaker on the other Sundays. The leader just needs to grab some quotes from Soul Matters for the discussion. The group currently meets at 7pm on the third Monday of the month.
