### THE CUU COMMUNICATION WHEELS

During the Covid lockdown, the way we communicated with one another was either via Zoom, email or by phone. Many of our decision during this time revolved around what the changing landscape of the Covid protocol would be from week-to-week or month-to-month. The Board of Directors (the Board) was charged with making these decisions in accordance with recommendations from the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) and the CDC. At times, the Board would reach out to the congregation for feedback or informational sessions as Covid protocols needed to be updated. Consequently, many of our activities were online with the main goal of staying connected as a congregation, remediating against isolation and depression amongst members and staying engaged in our individual and collective faith journeys. In addition, right before Covid hit the Board changed its governance structure. The Board is a programmatic/ strategic planning board now and has delegated trustee work to the various committee chairs. We did not have a chance to adjust to the new structure and really practice the logistics of how/who makes decisions and how they are communicated.

The Worship Committee, Congregational Life Committee and Outreach Committees are involved in great work. Currently, we do not have a trustee for Social Justice, Finance, Religious Exploration or Communications. Each committee has a budget and can make spending decisions within the confines of the budget. Moreover, each committee makes programmatic decisions within its subject-matter area. Ideally, the Board would convene a planning meeting with all of the trustees during the summer to plan themes and programs for the upcoming church year. The results of the meeting would be greater clarification of the charge of each committee and great symbiotic relationships between the committees and the Board. This has not been done due to all of the planning and pivoting that Covid has required. We can convene such a meeting in the Spring this year to make sure it happens before my term as president expires. We have also had a great question about how to make a request of our administrative assistant's, Nalina's, time and talents. Rev. Amy is Nalina's direct supervisor. In general, all requests need to go through Rev. Amy. Currently, Nalina's time is utilized by reoccurring duties and assisting with the auction. Please keep this in mind through the end of January. We do have seasonal activities such as the auction, fellowship/pledging and annual meeting. The Summer tends to be a better time for new administrative projects.

As always, we must move forward in covenant with each other. This means assuming we are acting with the best of intention.

#### CAKES FOR THE QUEEN OF HEAVEN

In 1977 the UUA General Assembly passed the Women & Religion Resolution. The impact of this resolution has been profound. Curricula celebrating the female as divine have been developed, including Cakes for the Queen of Heaven.

Cakes for the Queen of Heaven is a woman honoring adult RE curriculum developed by Dr. Shirley Ranck. It examines pre-Judeo Christian cultures that may have worshipped the female as the divine. The concepts of equality and reverence for the female in a religious setting are eye-opening to many participants.

The title for the curriculum comes from the book of Jeremiah in the Hebrew Bible wherein God speaks to Jeremiah, saying "Do you not see what they do in the cities of Judah and in the streets of Jerusalem? The children gather wood and the fathers kindle the fire, and the women knead the dough to make cakes to the Queen of Heaven and to pour out libations to other gods, in order to anger me!"

Who was the "Queen of Heaven?" Who were the people that worshiped her? What sort of society did they live in? How did that society change into today's society? These are questions explored in this workshop series.

When I moved to Maryland I was a member of the Towson Unitarian Universalist Congregation. The Women's group offered this curricula and I signed up to be part of this group. It was an enriching experience that had stayed with me until I became a member of Cedarhurst. At that time, Valerie Wills, who was our part time Minister, offered this course. Once again, I took it with a different set of women and found it to be just as rewarding.

### CAKES FOR THE QUEEN OF HEAVEN cont.

In 2004, I offered to teach the course at Cedarhurst. Each time I have taken it, I have come away with something different. A new insight, deeper relationships with the women in the group and an understanding that it is important to embrace the divine as a woman.

I will be once again teaching this course sometime in the future as part of Adult Religious Education.

Please consider joining me and the other woman interested in exploring the feminine divine. This course will be offered after Sunday services. Most classes will run 1- 2 hours. There are a total of 11 sessions between part one and part two.
