
INTRODUCTION

Cedarhurst's New Outreach Campaign

A three-year Outreach campaign was launched this Spring with the goal of introducing people to our denomination and inviting them to come visit and get to know us. It involved a pile of work by quite a few of Cedarhurst friends and members. And it is starting to bear fruit.

Cedarhurst volunteers staffed each booth in two-hour shifts, one booth each month from June to October. You may have visited the booth at Art in the Park, PRIDE, Fall Fest and the Westminster Farmers Market. After greeting hundreds of people to introduce our Principles written on a big poster, more than 40 new people provided their contact information, of which eight have already visited Cedarhurst in-person, including several young families. We are staying in touch with this group regularly by text, email, phone and even hand written letters.

A good number of members and friends, including Rev. Amy, developed the Campaign. The group chose the phrase "LOVE and JUSTICE in ACTION" as the campaign theme and worked hard to design new banners, paper labels and decorative circular seals to make sure that every item associated with the booth would show that wording plus our website address. In fact, many of you participated in a fast-paced "Slap-A-Label" session following a recent Sunday Service. Within about 30 minutes, we slapped labels on more than 700 snack items to be given out at our various booths. Wow! That was fun and we'll definitely do it again next season.

The list of new materials included creating a new Cedarhurst brochure along with two new banners and poster art listing our 8 Principles, all bearing the campaign theme. The booth itself includes a royal blue collapsible canopy and portable tables with cheery cloths and chairs.

The campaign is grounded in census-based data suggesting that the growth areas of Carroll County are Eldersburg, Sykesville and Mt Airy, with Reisterstown showing less growth. Additionally, Westminster is the center of the county's young adult/college population thanks to the presence of McDaniel and the Carroll Community College. These are our areas of concentration.

Now that the Summer festivals are over for this year, the outreach group is investigating additional events and activities to introduce our Unitarian Universalist denomination to more people and invite them to come visit Cedarhurst, attend several services and get to know us a little better.
