## FROM THE MINISTER

General Assembly happens each year and is an important time in our movement. It is a time to do business, make social justice statements, meet other UUs, do workshops, and be part of the democratic process of making decisions for our faith movement.

This year was especially important because we were considering if the Article 2 Commission's report would be accepted, with amendments, and if we would continue to study Article 2 for another year so that we can vote in 2024 whether to accept it or to begin all over again.

As you read the above, there are some significant questions that you may be asking – what is Article 2? Why was a commission created to create a new Article 2? And what does this mean for congregations.


Firstly, Article 2 is the section of the UUA bylaws where we lay out what we believe and the sources we draw from. Within Article 2, we presently have the 7 principles and our 6 sources. As you know, our congregation and many others have added the 8<sup>th</sup> principle (<u>https://www.8thprincipleuu.org</u>). Because we are a congregational system, each congregation could add the 8<sup>th</sup> principle, but it takes the entire General Assembly to make changes to Article 2 of the UUA Bylaws.

Through a 5-year process the Article 2 commission was set up which studied, examined, interviewed thousands of individuals and hundreds of congregations, to determine what Unitarian Universalists believe today. The Article 2 commission generated a report which was accepted with amendments, this year. This means that we will have a year to study, discuss, and examine, so that we as a congregation can determine if it expresses our values.

So what is in Article 2 commissions' report? The report names that the primary value of Unitarian Universalists is Love and there are 6 values through which we express this love. Those values are equity, transformation, pluralism, generosity, justice, and interdependence.

The visual at the end of this article is one of the ways of understanding the report. Another is for you to examine the report for yourself and join in discussion groups that we will be setting up this fall.

## FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

Good news! I survived my first Board meeting as President! Actually, it was not only productive, but enjoyable. We all got to know each other a little bit better, and we will continue to do that as part of each monthly meeting. Knowing each other's unique perspectives, as well as approaches to problem solving, will help us work together as a team.

At our July meeting, we discussed:

- How we can support our re-emerging Religious Exploration (RE) program for kids (the UU equivalent of "Sunday School"). This project is headed up by Sherry Dean and Bekah Waters. But they will need the support of ALL of us to make this the success we know it can be. The Board is fully behind this in every way including financially, but it will take your help, too.
- Dividing up the 40+ inquiries about CUU resulting from the Cedarhurst booth at public events this summer – what a wonderful challenge! Hats off to Cindy Hirshberg for coordinating our outreach efforts, and to all our volunteers at the booths. Way to go!
- Maintenance of our AC/Heating units in the sanctuary.
- Repair/replacement of dehumidifiers downstairs. Since the lowest part of our building is below ground level, humidity is an issue that always has to be addressed.
- David Pittman, our Treasurer, let us know that our *number* of pledges is up, as well as the rate of *payment* of pledges. This is great news, and while it may be in part due to being back in person in the building, it also indicates increased support of Cedarhurst.
- Related to that, please know that your Board takes seriously our responsibility to use your pledge dollars frugally. There are necessary monthly expenses, but we will keep you informed and where appropriate, involved, regarding unexpected large ticket expenditures.

In my own journey, let me share that I had the pleasure of directing the adult choir again this year at CERSI (Central East Region Summer Institute). This is a UU regional week long "camp" (dorm rooms, not tents...) for ALL AGES, that includes eight states (Ohio, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, northern Virginia) plus the District of Columbia.

In conversations throughout that week, I learned what's happening (or not) in lots of UU congregations. This knowledge, and these network connections, will be very useful as I serve on the Board over the next two years. CERSI attendees were impressed with what is happening at Cedarhurst. One thing we have that serves us well is future orientation, and a positive attitude.

Let's keep the momentum going!

### CUU VIRTUAL GAME NIGHT - Saturday, August 12th at 7:00pm on Zoom


