When I was a lay person, I would often wonder when to call my minister. As your minister, I want to help you know when to call me. The list below is adapted from the website of the Unitarian Universalist Community Church of Augusta Maine.

When to call me as your minister:

- When you just want to talk.
- When you are looking for a way to deepen your spiritual life.
- When you have questions of faith and you would like me to visit with you.
- When your children have questions of faith and you would like me to visit with them.
- When you have religious or spiritual questions.
- When you are celebrating one of life's joys and want to share the good news.
- When your family has joys and accomplishments to share with their minister.
- When you are feeing sad, lonely, or lost.
- When you have lost your job, found a new job, been promoted or demoted.

- When you or a family member is ill.
- When you are going to the hospital or know of someone else in the congregation who is.
- When someone close to you has died or is critically ill or you're dealing with a significant loss of some kind.
- When you would like to make plans for a memorial service. When you would like to make plans for your memorial service.
- When you are planning to be married. When you are challenged by the demands of marriage. When you are separated or planning to get a divorce.
- When you are pregnant and glad you are or wish you weren't, also if you want to be pregnant but aren't.
- When you are challenged by life's daily happenings.
- When you don't know me, but would like to.
- When your family doesn't know me, but would like to.
- When you feel ready to join the congregation.
- When you want to share your experience of or appreciation for our beloved community. When you have concerns about the church or our faith community.
- When you have a good story to share.
- When you just want to share time with me.

FROM THE MINISTER - Water Communion



Last month we had our Water Communion, which is also known as Water Ceremony. It is a ritual that CUU has practiced since our inception. Every year we each bring a small offering of water that symbolizes somewhere or something special to us. We pour the water into one bowl. This symbolizes our unity; although we are individuals, we come together as a whole in community.

Our recent Water Communion ceremony at Cedarhurst was moving, as each person came to share their wishes and visions for the new year or shared the symbolism of the water. More than one person brought water from Cedarhurst to symbolize the feeling of spiritual community that they find here.





Water communion is a quintessential part of Unitarian Universalist Congregations. It originated in 1980 at the Women and Religion Continental Convocation of Unitarian Universalists and was created by Carolyn McDade and Lucile Schuck.

I also notice some of the ways we welcome people into this space, like the child -size tables and chairs in the back of the sanctuary, ready for young visitors to draw and cut and paste to their heart's content. Our beautiful sign outside lets the public know that we welcome people of all skin tones, people of all gender identities & sexual orientations, people who love who they love.

I find myself thinking "What else can we be doing beyond furniture and signs that proactively welcomes everyone to our space?" On Sunday mornings, we can greet people by name (nametags come in handy...) before the service, and personally invite them to stay for refreshments and conversation after the service. We can make sure we limit "business talk," in favor of conversations where we get to know others better, and let them get to know us.

UU's are not typically evangelical by nature, but we can let friends or family know about our congregation and why we like it. That's not proselytizing. It's sharing something good, and someone might need to hear about a place like Cedarhurst UU. What ideas do you have that promote inclusion and welcoming?


October - New Members Class begins—Every Wednesday at 6:00pm
