

Our principles are living principles; they have never been static or the same, they have changed over time. They are not a creed, so they must change from time to time. Though they have been examined many times, the UU principles have not changed since 1986 when the 7th principle was added.

As time has progressed and the 8th principle has been passed in many, but not all congregations, it has become clear that UU's needed to examine what we believe. After thousands of conversations with laity (those at the 2018 GA probably remember the small group discussions), ministers, congregations, and UU theologians, changes have been proposed and a sense of who we are and what we value came to the forefront.

It became clear that our central value is Love as the power which holds us together, and from this core value all other values emerged. These include Interdependence, Justice, Transformation, Equity, and Generosity. In the coming months we will be exploring these values and how they are expressed in Article 2. This study is in preparation for the vote at GA 2024 to vote up or down these values and expression of who we are.

I hope you thought of some positive things about CUU that you are grateful for!

One thing that happened in 2023 made me profoundly grateful for a place like Cedarhurst. During a wonderful visit from our friend Ed in June, we learned that he had been almost bodily thrown out of his Church of England parish in Cambridge. Why? Because he was transgender. His parish priest told him he was no longer welcome, and to stay away from the building. Our hearts broke for our friend. I felt both sad and angry, and at the same time realized, again, how important it is for this place we call Cedarhurst to continue to grow and thrive.

The Board continues our work of prioritizing repair and renovation projects for our building. Special thanks to Steve Hirsh for scheduling (now completed) repair and maintenance of our heating system for both upstairs and downstairs. Next on the list is repairs to the boiler room downstairs. Then we will be looking at bigger projects.

As Rev Amy said in her article, we will be examining Article 2 during the winter and spring of 2024, as will UU congregations across North America. I will be learning right along with you. What I do know is that a tremendous amount of work, over several years and involving a large number of people (not just UUA leaders) went into this proposed bylaws amendment, and I personally believe that our faith must evolve as society changes and as national and world events and trends demand. But we will be deciding as a congregation whether or not we think Article 2 should be adopted at the online UUA General Assembly in June.

Also related to the above, Lenore Bajare-Dukes, our primary contact from the UUA and a skilled group facilitator (also a delightful person who has already met with our Board) will be with us on **Sunday**, **February 4** for the service, and then to conduct a 2-3 hour workshop with us beginning at 12:00 noon. I highly encourage you to attend – this is an opportunity to share your hopes and dreams for CUU, and we'll also talk about our soon-to-be-a-reality Religious Education program.
