But now there are equally capable, confidential, sensitive and supportive ministers available to you. The way it works is: call or text me, Becky Zimmerman, at 443-789-1886 (day or night), let me know briefly what you're in need of (such as illness or death of a loved one, or a personal need) and I will contact the on-call minister to get you connected as quickly as possible.

#### Here's what's coming down the pike at Cedarhurst:

1. The Search Committee for a new minister, chaired by David Pittman, has begun meeting and will be seeking your input very soon. Please read David's update elsewhere in this Companion!

2.Stewardship Season will kick off on **Sunday, April 14** with a **Fellowship Lunch** (right after Gerry Galuardi's allmusic service)! This a time for learning from each other what motivates our giving to CUU, including our time, talents, and financial resources. I hope you can be there on April 14 for this fun kick-off.

3.**Sunday, May 5** is *another* lunch after the service, this time to roll out for you the <u>proposed renovation plan for</u> <u>our building</u>. Don't worry – nothing is starting immediately – we will discuss it on May 5, and vote on it at the Annual Meeting on June 2. The "flinging of dirt with a shovel" is a long way off yet!

As we continue down this path of ministerial transition, please know that you may reach out to me or any Board member, to David and the Search Committee, and to our on-call ministers (call/text me to get connected) for any reason. We are here. We are in this together. And we are Cedarhurst Strong.

### Cedarhurst UU Search Committee

Cedarhurst UU's Board has designated a Search Committee to fill our vacant minister position. The members of this committee are David Pittman (Chair), Alan Bogage, Roderic Hooks, Lisa Miller, Beth Schilpp, and Becky Zimmerman.

We're following the UUA's recommended process for hiring a contract minister. A critical early step will be to obtain input from the congregation. Therefore, we will soon distribute a short questionnaire via email. We hope you will respond quickly so we can consider your preferences as we prepare to post the position on the UUA's **Ministry Search and Jobs Application Portal**. This electronic forum for connecting congregations with prospective ministers will be our primary source of candidates. While we may reach out to certain individuals to let them know we would welcome their application, we won't circumvent the UUA's recommended process.

Spring might not be the optimal season for starting a ministry search. Those who are looking for new positions may have already applied for other positions and might even be receiving offers. While we would prefer to fill the vacancy quickly, please be patient while we make an earnest effort to find a great candidate. 
April's book is Small Mercies by Dennis Lehane.
