#### Cedarhurst to Welcome a New Minister

I hope you're as excited as I am to welcome Reverend Kimberley Debus into Cedarhurst UU's family. Personally, I'm grateful because, as Chair of the Search Committee, I know how much time and effort the members of the Committee and the Board contributed to making this possible. After interviewing two candidates, and finding both to be more than satisfactory, the Committee asked the rest of the Board to join our selection process.

All of the search participants should be commended for giving this effort the attention it required and deserved. For example, Beth Schilpp called in to the meetings from her trip to New Hampshire. Sherry Dean topped that by calling in from her trip to South America. Steve Hirsh came to meetings both hyped up and frazzled from having just watched his son Isaac win another round on Jeopardy! Alan Bogage squeezed Cedarhurst into his busy schedule despite having pressing family obligations. At our request, Cindy Hirshberg stayed with our search team for a couple of extra weeks after her term on the Board ended. Lisa Miller attended our meetings during an especially demanding time at her job and her dog's sudden illness. In addition to everything else the members of the committee had to do, Roderic Hooks contributed excellent minutes after every Committee meeting. And regarding Becky Zimmerman, it shouldn't be necessary to point out how challenging it has been to lead our congregation in the absence of a minister while also participating in the process of selecting a new one. For me, this has been a rewarding opportunity to get to know each of these dedicated members a little better, and to make a lasting contribution to our congregation.

From the outset, we knew we'd have to find an exceptional candidate to satisfy your many and varied desires. Via your survey responses, you requested:

- "A minister with a history of creative ways to energize and grow an intergenerational community."
- "... more sermons that make me want to get out there and do something. We need a minister who can build excitement in our community. Someone who talks about what is going on in the world and how our faith community can get out there and make a difference."
- " ... a high energy minister ..."
- "... someone who is dynamic. ... a pulpit presence that delivers thoughtful sermons that make you think and ponder that particular sermon. Someone who connects with old and young alike."
- "... open-minded about spiritual paths that people might take and help them in their journeys."
- "... a 'people person' in a new minister, someone with almost an entertainer personality who can compel attention during a sermon and tell a good story in a sermon."
- "... someone with a much larger depth and breadth of experience, reading and understanding of world events, and is cognizant that vocal delivery is very very important."
- "... a minister that has had experience helping a congregation grow. CUU needs a minister with pastoral counseling experience and is comfortable in this role. A minster that is comfortable with congregational response to sermons. A minister who knows the importance of social justice work. A minister who is comfortable at the pulpit. A minister who is flexible and able to adjust to the needs of the congregation. A minister with a fresh perspective to help us grow."
- "I hope a new minister will bring a fresh approach to all aspects of church life and a willingness among the congregation to respond and try new ideas."

Whatever you were hoping for, please join me in welcoming Reverend Kimberley with an open mind and an open heart. Cedarhurst is very fortunate to have this opportunity to hire such an accomplished and well-rounded minister to lead us into a bright and prosperous future.




