### Here are the three overall goals the Board & Rev. Kimberley identified:




Outreach - intentionally reaching out to people in our community who are more liberal leaning, making sure they know we exist and that we're excited about growing our congregation. Have you shared what you like about Cedarhurst with anyone lately? Have you invited anyone to a service or event or activity? That's where it starts.





Family Ministry – attracting families to Cedarhurst in new and creative ways. Listening to parents about what they want & need, and how and when they can bring their children & youth to Cedarhurst. Who do you know that might be yearning for a place like ours – a safe place, a welcoming place, a happening place?





Elevate Cedarhurst! - The Board wants to see everyone truly excited about, and invested in, this venture you approved with a 94% "yes" vote (there were no "no's" - two ballots were not marked either way). We believe that expanding and improving our building will say to the public, "We are alive and well, and we want you to come check us out!" What if each of us said that to someone this week?

Momentum naturally builds when we see things happening, and right now a lot of behind-the-scenes preliminary work is taking place in **Elevate Cedarhurst!** But very soon we will see changes that will make the project real. Our architect Dean Camlin recently confirmed my expectation that most, if not all, of Elevate Cedarhurst! will be completed in time for our 40th Anniversary in October of 2025.

That's fabulous! But Outreach and Family Ministry are ongoing activities that are happening right now. Without them, we don't need a bigger, improved building. So borrow some enthusiasm from me or Rev. Kimberley if you need to, and tell your open-minded friends and family about your congregation and all the great things that are happening. Invite them to an activity, special event, or Sunday service. Then they can decide if we are what they're looking for.


